The children do not need to wear their costumes all day and are welcome to bring regular clothes and change at any time during the day. #### **Food and Treats**



Parents are invited to send store-bought, individually pre-packaged food and treats to school with their child for such events as birthdays and special classroom celebrations (please consult your child's teacher for specific classroom routines). All food sent to school to be shared with the class must be commercially packaged. This means such items as cake, cupcakes, and cookies baked and packaged at home (wrapped with cellophane) are not permitted. In addition, all packaged items must be labelled 'NUT FREE'. If baked at home or not labelled 'nut free,' the food will be returned home with the child who brought it to school.

## **Safe Arrival Absence Reporting**



#### **SafeArrival Student Absence Reporting**

The SafeArrival student absence reporting system reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, making it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these three convenient methods. To create your account, please use the same email address/phone number that you use for PowerSchool. If you do not have your PowerSchool login information, please contact your child's school for assistance.

- 1. Using your **mobile device**, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store, or via the links on the SchoolMessenger website<sup>2</sup>. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. To report an absence, Select Attendance.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website<sup>3</sup>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account.To report an absence, Select Attendance.
- 3. Call the **toll-free number** (1-833-244-5565) to report an absence using the automated phone system.

More information about SafeArrival is available in this handbook<sup>4</sup>. Your child's school can also provide guidance.


### **School Council**

### Literacy Spotlight



#### What is UFLI?

UFLI, (you fly), stands for the University of Florida Literacy Institute. It is a research-based literacy framework that helps students develop strong reading skills. At CCA, we use UFLI in grades 1 - 3 to ensure that all children are learning to read in a structured and effective way.

#### How does UFLI work?

UFLI focuses on teaching the foundational skills of reading, including:

- Phonemic awareness (understanding sounds in words)
- Phonics (connecting sounds to letters)
- Fluency (reading smoothly and accurately)
- Vocabulary (understanding the meaning of words)
- Comprehension (understanding what they read)

It's like teaching children the building blocks of reading, step-by-step, to make sure they master each skill before moving on to more complex ones.

#### Why is UFLI important?

This approach is highly effective because it is based on the latest research in how children learn to read. It helps students of all levels—whether they are struggling or excelling—by giving them the tools they need to become confident and successful readers.

#### How can parents help at home?

You can support your child by:

- 1. Encouraging them to practice reading daily.
- 2. Asking them about the sounds and letters they are learning.
- 3. Reading together to build a love for books and stories.

### Living Books Book Fair



### Away All Day - Personal Media Device Policy



This letter was sent to families earlier this week.

#### Dear CCA families,

Thank you for your support in helping CCA maximize learning time and minimize distractions with the implementation of Administrative Procedure (AP) 148: Responsible use of Personal Mobile Devices and Social Media in Schools<sup>6</sup> this September. We are impressed with the students' cooperation and the improved classroom focus.

On Thursday, September 19th, our school council discussed whether personal mobile devices should continue to be allowed during non-instructional time such as lunch, or travel to field trips. In addition, on the week of September 16th, our parent community was asked to submit feedback and suggestions for technology use during non-instructional time to the school email address. Those who participated in the meeting and email feedback voiced their preference that these devices are to be kept away during the full school day (7:52 a.m. - 2:20 p.m.). Following this consultation with the school community, we have decided to implement this change at CCA as permitted in AP 148.

Beginning Monday, October 7th students must keep all personal mobile devices away during school hours (7:52-2:20) unless specifically authorized by their teacher or school administration for academic or medical purposes in accordance with AP148.

They may use them before or after school and on the bus/playground outside of school hours but not on the bus during field trips or during recess or lunch.

Thank you for your cooperation as we make these adjustments in our schools to protect our instructional time in the best interests of student learning.


